



Quincy is one of seven vineyards that comprise the Centre Loire region. Its single grape variety, Sauvignon, is also the region's emblematic grape variety.

The vines are cultivated on ancient terraces of the Cher River. This sedimentary origin imparts a distinctive flavor profile to the wines, showcasing the full potential of Sauvignon.



Terroir

The 'Les Beauces' parcel is located just above the estate and is made up of a complex terroir of predominantly clay gravel.

Grape variet

100% Sauvignon. Vineyard planted in 1980.

Superficie de production

The surface area of production is 0.30 ha, or around 2500 vines (60 hl/ha).

Vinification

The grapes are harvested by hand and pressed, then undergo a 12 to 24hour debourbling process. The wine is then fermented and aged in a chêne barrel for eleven months.

Characteristics

This wine boasts a complex aromatic profile and has been carefully cellared to ensure an exceptional quality and longevity.

Tasting notes

The product is recommended for those with a penchant for caramel, honey and candied pineapple. It boasts a rounded, sweet mouthfeel with a hint of freshness, culminating in a rich, comforting finish.



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
